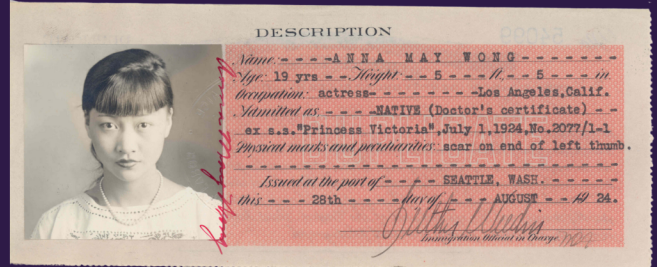

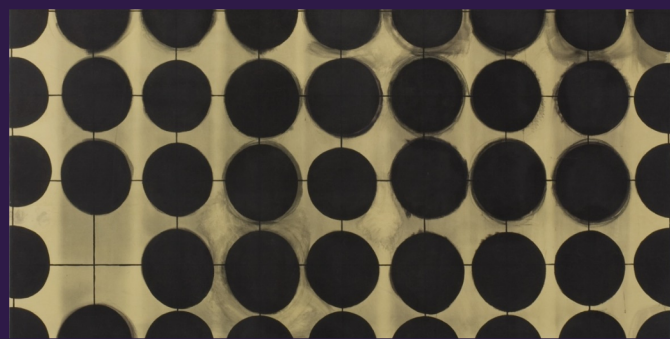
Profiles in Asian American Pacific Islander History

Anna Mae Wong

The first Chinese American movie star in Hollywood, Anna Mae Wong rose to fame during an era when the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 still cast its long shadow over American life. Despite being born in Los Angeles, Wong was required to carry this document, and was relentlessly typecast, denied lead roles opposite non-Asian actors due to anti-miscegenation laws, and often had to travel abroad to find parts that honored her talent. Wong's legacy stands as both a celebration of artistic triumph and a reminder of the barriers she helped to break.



Kazuko Miyamoto



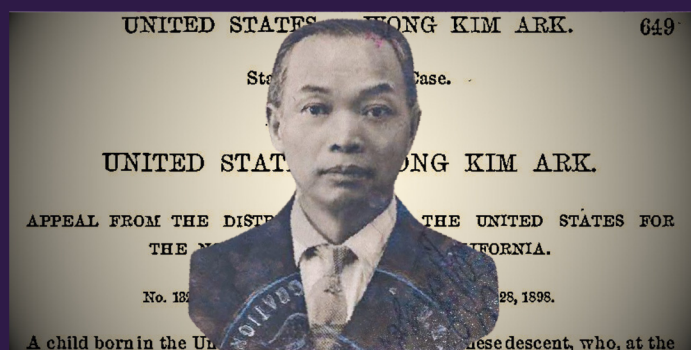
This artwork titled "Go" (1971) created by Japanese-American artist Kazuko Miyamoto (b.1942) was inspired by the game Go (Igo. Baduk in Korea and Weiqi in China,) an ancient game of strategy still played today. She pushed the boundaries of Minimal Art, building bridges between Western art practices and her Japanese heritage.

Queen Lili'uokalani

Queen Lili'uokalani was Hawaii's final reigning monarch. A visionary leader, composer, poet, and peacemaker, she sought to safeguard her nation's sovereignty and culture but was forcibly overthrown by sugar barons and the U.S. military in 1893. Often remembered in movements for justice and peaceful resistance, Queen Lili'uokalani teaches us to "never cease to act because you fear you may fail."



Wong Kim Ark



In 1898, Wong Kim Ark, a San Francisco-born Chinese American, won the Supreme Court case that confirmed birthright citizenship for all children born on U.S. soil, paving the way for the 14th Amendment. In a time when the Chinese Exclusion Act painted immigrants as perpetual outsiders, Wong's legal victory became a pivotal moment impacting all Americans in defining what it means to belong in America.

•CINCO DE MAYO, (WHICH IS NOT THE MEXICAN INDEPENDENCE DAY,) CELEBRATES THE VICTORY OF THE MEXICAN ARMY OVER THE FRENCH ARMY AT THE BATTLE OF PUEBLA IN 1862.

•MOTHER'S DAY IS CELEBRATED ON THE SECOND SUNDAY IN MAY. OFFICIALLY ESTABLISHED IN 1914 BY PRESIDENT WOODROW WILSON, THE HOLIDAY POSSIBLY RESULTED IN THE WIDESPREAD USE OF THE QUESTION, "HAVE YOU TELEGRAPHED YOUR MOTHER TODAY?"

•THE EMPIRE STATE BUILDING OPENED ON MAY 1, 1931. THE TALLEST BUILDING IN THE WORLD AT THE TIME, IT INCLUDED A MOORING MAST TO DOCK DIRIGIBLES. WHILE THIS PLAN WAS ABANDONED, THE 200 FOOT MOORING STILL REMAINS AS PART OF THE ARCHITECTURE.
